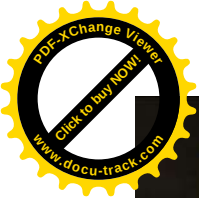

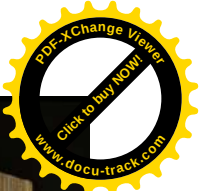

*I beg to report that about September
1914, my wife volunteered for service as a
Nurse under the British Red Cross Society
and was stationed at various hospitals
in this Country until 26th October 1918; she
was then at Seaford, Sussex. On the above
date I received a communication from her,
and my reply was returned "gone away".
I subsequently made enquiry at all likely
places and took all necessary steps
to trace her but could obtain no information
as to her whereabouts. The facts were
reported when the question of Income Tax
arose, and since that time no rebate in
respect of Income Tax for my wife has
been allowed.*

information by her Parents or Relatives.*

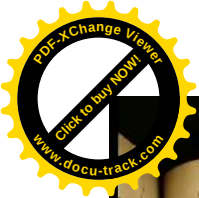
